CIRCULAR 2: CALL FOR NOMINATIONS TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES 2022-2025. ELECTED AT THE TRIENNIAL WORLD CONFERENCE 2022

ACWW'S Board of Trustees are elected every three years at the Triennial World Conference. A secret ballot will be held for the 30th Triennial World Conference in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in May 2022.

- All those elected to office become Members of the Board of Trustees of the Associated Country Women of the World, a charity registered in England and Wales. This post carries legal responsibilities.
- The Board of Trustees are collectively responsible for maintaining an effective and relevant Strategic Plan for ACWW.
- The 6 Committee Chairmen (Agriculture, Communications & Marketing, Finance & Membership, Projects, Triennial World Conference, and United Nations), together with the World President and Deputy World President, form the Executive Committee.
- A Nominee must be a fully paid-up **Individual Member (Category 5)** of ACWW both at the time of Nomination, and at the time of Election.
- A Nominee must also be an active member of a fully paid-up **Voting Member Society (Category 1, 2, or 3)** of ACWW. All Nominees require a written reference letter from their own Society in support of their nomination. Additionally, Nominees for the post of Area President must be permanent residents within the Area they wish to represent.
- Members of the Board of Trustees serve in their own right and, once elected, do not act as representatives of their own Society or country.
- The **Working Language of ACWW is English**, and Nominees must understand, write, and speak English, and be fully able to participate in meetings in English, and read all correspondence.
- Those elected to the Board of Trustees will be provided with an ACWW-issued computer. Nominees must have a good working knowledge of Microsoft Windows, Microsoft Office, and have regular access to the internet, as there is a need to work by email with ACWW Member Societies, Board Members, and Central Office.
- No individual may accept nomination for more than one position on the Board of Trustees. If multiple nominations for different positions are received at Central Office, the one received first will stand as the official nomination. It is the responsibility of the Nominee to ensure they do not accept nomination for more than one position.
- Nominees for the office of Area President must have **attended at least one Area Conference**. All other Nominees must have **attended at least one Triennial World Conference**.
- All Members of the Board of Trustees are involved in policy making, and are responsible for distributing accurate information regarding ACWW. They should encourage rural women's organisations and individuals to become members.
- Area Presidents should keep in touch with the Member Societies within their Area. They are expected to organise a financially independent Area Conference once per Triennium, in conjunction with Member Societies in the Area. They are also expected to act as a two-way conduit for information, surveys, data collection, and policy input between the Membership and ACWW.

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Meetings Board Meetings are normally held at ACWW Central Office in London. At present, the Board of Trustees meets annually, and the Executive Committee meets three times a year. The Finance and Membership Committee meets 3 times annually, and the other Committees 2 or 3 times a year as required. Board Members are ex officio members of the Specified Committees and may additionally attend these meetings at their own expense, with the prior permission of the Chairman and if space allows.

All Nominees should be available to attend all scheduled meetings of the Board of Trustees and, where relevant, Specified Committees as a priority. They must also make every effort to attend the Triennial World Conference. Whilst attendance in person will always be preferred, it is understood that circumstances sometimes make this impossible. In this instance, attendance via digital videoconference (using Microsoft Teams, Zoom, or similar applications) can be arranged in consultation with the World President.

Travel and Subsistence When travelling to Board and Committee meetings, and on other pre-approved ACWW business, all Members of the Board of Trustees make their own arrangements, including full insurance cover and visa applications, unless otherwise notified. ACWW will reimburse these costs together with airport and departure taxes. Return economy travel (doorstep-to-doorstep), accommodation and expenses for meals are reimbursed. All claims for expenses are submitted to the Chief Executive Office for approval by the Treasurer, and must be accompanied by the relevant receipts.

Specific Notes for Nominees seeking election in May 2022

All nominees must be available to attend the post-Conference Board Meeting in May 2022. This will extend 4 days beyond the last day of the Triennial World Conference and include important Board Training and strategic discussion. This will take place 25-28th May 2022.

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Responsibilities for Members of the Board of Trustees

World President Acts as the official representative of ACWW; presides over meetings and Triennial World Conferences. Involves extensive travel, keeping in touch with all of ACWW's geographic Areas. Requires detailed knowledge of ACWW works and the Constitution.

Deputy World President In 2022 ACWW will elect a Deputy World President separately from the previous joint role of Deputy World President and Chairman of the Agriculture Committee, per the Constitutional Resolution passed at the 29th Triennial World Conference in 2019. Must be prepared to represent ACWW when the World President is unavailable, and work to a portfolio of issues as agreed by the Board of Trustees.

Chairman of the Triennial Conference Committee and Honorary Secretary Is responsible for planning the Triennial World Conference. Experience of such conferences and ACWW operations is essential, along with experience of organising international events.

Chairman of the Finance & Membership Committee and Honorary Treasurer Will have charge of the funds and accounts of ACWW, present annual budgets, receive and approve all Board and Committee expenditures. Financial experience is essential.

Chairman of the Agriculture Committee In 2022 ACWW will elect a Chairman of the Agriculture Committee separately from the previous joint role of Chairman of the Agriculture Committee and Deputy World President, per the Constitutional Resolution passed at the 29th Triennial World Conference in 2019. A knowledge and experience of rural agriculture, farming, and international food systems is essential.

Chairman of the Communications & Marketing Committee To have an overview and insight into the public presentation of ACWW. A knowledge of and experience in, social media and marketing is essential. Additionally, a high level of technical capability is necessary, with comfort using multiple forms of communication. Excellent spoken and written English are a prerequisite.

Chairman of the Projects Committee To have knowledge or experience of ACWW's project funding and nature of project impact assessment. Ideally, Nominees to have knowledge of development projects and international development. Ability to remain objective and impartial whilst applying ACWW criteria is essential.

Chairman of the United Nations Committee To have knowledge and interest in the advocacy role of ACWW, and how this interacts with the United Nations, UN Agencies, and other NGOs and INGOs. Experience of working within or alongside UN mechanisms within the past six years is preferable, and the ability to participate in the drafting of policy and public statements is desirable.

Area Presidents Represent and encourage new and existing members in their Areas. They must arrange an Area Conference once per Triennium. They must have a good working knowledge of Member Societies in their respective Area, and a passion for the inclusion of all individuals and Member Societies in their work. Good organisational skills are essential.

- The Nominating Society must complete Section 3.
- A letter of confirmation and support from the Nominee's own Voting Member Society (Categories 1, 2, or 3) **must accompany the nomination**.
