The High Level Political Forum (HLPF) is the part of the UN that is responsible for examining progress on the Sustainable Development Goals. They do this through evaluating different countries each year, giving the country the chance to present a self-evaluation, called the Voluntary National Review or VNR, and then calling on non-governmental organisations (NGOs) in that country to give their own review. Because the voices of NGOs are silenced in some countries, or because there are no organisations that represent Rural Women, ACWW steps in to ensure that the voices of Rural Women are heard, and that governments are giving inaccurate reports on the state of rural communities are challenged.

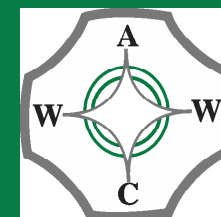

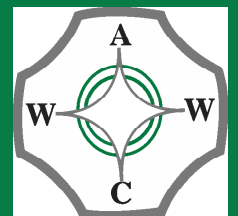

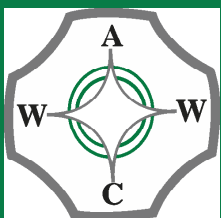

The International Day of Rural Women was first known as World Rural Women’s Day. It was conceptualised by ACWW and 2 other women’s organisations in 1995 at the Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing in 1995. Since then, it has been taken up by the UN and is now called the International Day of Rural Women. ACWW, though we no longer facilitate the day, still seeks to highlight the unique role of Rural Women in food production and food systems especially in light of the UN Decade for Family Farming. This year, the postponed Women Walk the World will take place on 15 October, and it is a great opportunity for you to help your community learn about ACWW and the unique role played by Rural Women in food systems.

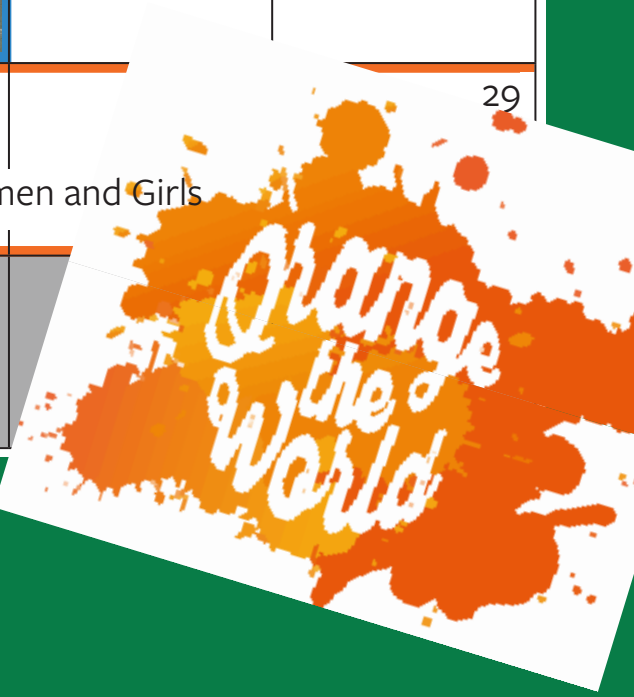
